Ethel M. McLellan, chairman, Civil Service Commission, has announced the following appointments:

H. M. (Henk) Ploeger as director, sectoral and regional policy branch, Ministry of Treasury and Economics.

Mr. Ploeger graduated in economics from McMaster University and did his postgraduate studies at the University of Toronto. He joined the Ontario government in 1959, serving in progressively more responsible positions within the area of economic policy and virtually all aspects of government finance. He played an important part in creating what is now the office of the budget and the intergovernmental finance policy branch, of which he has been the director since 1972.

R. E. (Bob) Youtz as director, community health programs branch, Ministry of Health.

Mr. Youtz began his career with the Ontario government in 1972 as an economist with the planning and research branch of the Ministry of Community and Social

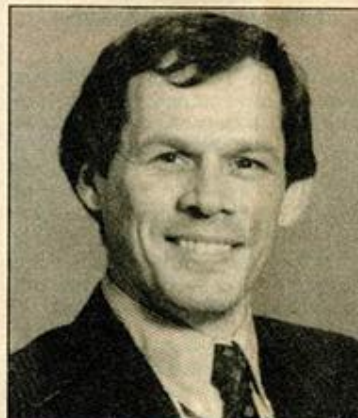

Since 1983, Mr. Youtz has been program co-ordinator of the health services organization/community health centre program in the community health programs branch, and, most recently, acting director.

Mr. Tylee joined the ministry in 1971, after obtaining an honors degree in economics from the University of Exeter and an MA in economics from the University of Toronto. His early career includes several years in Britain and Zimbabwe as statistician, lecturer and researcher. In Treasury's office of the budget and intergovernmental finance, Mr. Tylee advanced from economist to senior budget adviser. In October, 1982, he was appointed director, statistical services branch, and in June, 1984, as a result of restructuring in the ministry,
